Update Appeals

The first letter is on behalf of Darius Evangelista who was tortured and murdered by POLICE in the Philippines.

Margie Evangelista's husband had been missing since his arrest on 5 March 2010. Imagine her shock when someone told her that on 17 August 2010 a video of her husband being tortured was broadcasted in a news program on national television in the Philippines (and then worldwide on CNN, Al Jazeera and youtube).

The Evangelista family has filed a criminal complaint for torture against nine policemen. The primary suspect, who was seen committing the act of torture in the video, was dismissed by the National Police in January 2011. He later worked as a lecturer for a criminology college, teaching crime detection investigation to trainee policemen and women.

In November 2011, a Manila Court ordered the arrest of seven of the policemen suspected of torture in the case. Joselito Binayug, Joaquin de Guzman, Rodolfo Ong, Dante Bautista, Nonito Binayug, Rex Binayug, and Rogelio Rosales, Jr. were charged for the violation of the Anti Torture Act of 2009. The case remains pending in court. As of June 2012, only two of the suspects are in custody, and the other suspects including the primary suspect and his superior are in hiding.

The second letter is on behalf of Ahmet Yildiz, 26, a physics student who represented his country at an international gay gathering in San Francisco in 2007. He was shot leaving a cafe near the Bosphorus strait. Fatally wounded, the student tried to flee the attackers in his car, but lost control, crashed at the side of the road and died shortly afterwards in hospital. His friends believe Mr Yildiz was the victim of the country's first gay honour killing.

Ahmet's father, Yahya Yildiz, stands charged with murder after traveling 600 miles, allegedly hunting his son down and then shooting him five times on July 15, 2008. It is viewed as the country's first reported anti-gay "honour killing." And critics say that after three years, a pattern of indifference by the police in prosecuting the crime underscores the injustice.

Turkey was all but closed to the world until 1980 but its desire for European Union membership has imposed strains on a society formerly kept on a tight leash. As the notion of rights for minorities such as women and gays has blossomed, the country's civil society becomes more vibrant by the day. But the changes have brought a backlash from traditionalist circles wedded to the old regime.

Against this backdrop, the issues of women's rights, sexuality and the place of religion in the public arena have been particularly contentious. Ahmet Yildiz's crime, his friends say, was to admit openly to his family that he was gay.

Thank you for taking these actions on this case.
